

ARIZONA HISTORICAL SOCIETY, fascinating historical display of Tucson and Arizona, 949 E. Second St.

ARIZONA-SONORA DESERT MUSEUM, living animals and plants of Sonoran Desert region. Unique exhibits, indoor and outdoor. On Kinney Rd., north of Old Tucson.

BIOSPHERE, reservations only. Tours call 520-896-6200.

BISBEE, rustic, turn-of-the-century town, home of Lavender Pit mine, one of world's largest open-pit copper mines. 24 miles south of Tombstone on Rt. 60; 95 miles southeast of Tucson.

CHILDREN'S MUSEUM, 200 S. 6th Ave., 884-7511, teaches the students about science and discovery, an interactive and participatory museum.

COLOSSAL CAVE, possibly the world's largest dry limestone cavern. Safe, easy to take tours. Take I-10 east to Vail exit, north to cave.

DAVIS MONTHAN A.F. BASE contains military aircraft storage and disposition center, hundreds of old planes. Call for tour times. Take any major east-west Tucson road east to Craycroft. Go south to the base. (For info and tours call 750-4717)

FORT HUACHUCA, 95 miles southeast of Tucson, wonderful museum and old fort.

KITT PEAK NATIONAL OBSERVATORY, established 1958, country's first national observatory, site of Mayall 156 telescope and McMath Solar telescope. Open to public. On Tohono O'odham Indian Reservation. 1-19 to Ajo Way exit, #66 west to Kitt Peak turnoff. 53 miles southwest of Tucson.

MADERA CANYON, in Santa Rita Mts., 15 miles east of Green Valley. Plants and animals rare in U.S. Bird watching "hotspot." Picnic areas and campgrounds. Take Continental Rd. east, turn right on Madera Canyon Rd.

MEXICO, Rocky Point. Tours--1-602-279-44813. Stock up on shrimp and pick up souvenirs. Rental apartments available.

MT. LEMMON, highest peak in Santa Catalinas. Skiing in winter, picnic areas, view points at various elevations. 1-10, east on Speedway to Wilmot Rd., left to Tanque Verde Rd., follow signs.

MUSEUM OF ART, 140 N. main Ave., 624-2333

NOGALES, OLD MEXICO Visitor pass unnecessary within 15 miles of border. Suggest parking on Arizona side and walk across border. 65 miles south of Tucson on 1-19.

ORGAN PIPE CACTUS NATIONAL MONUMENT - 516 square miles of Sonoran Desert, features rare organ pipe cactus. Exhibits, guided walks, scenic drive. 1-19 to Ajo Way exit, west on Hwy. 86 to town of Why, left on Hwy. 85 to entrance.

PATAGONIA LAKE, newer recreational lake, fishing and boating. Stop in town of Patagonia. 1-19 south to Nogales; highway 82 northeast to Patagonia.

PETE KITCHEN'S RANCH, home of only white settler to hold out against Apache raids in 1800's. Fine museum. Off 1-19 south, just north of Mexican border.

PENA BLANCA LAKE - 52-acre lake near Mexican border. Fishing, boat rental, campgrounds, picnic areas. 1-19 south, west on Ruby Rd.

PIMA AIR MUSEUM - Outdoor display covering 80 years of aviation history. Take 1-10, east to Wilmot Rd., north 2 miles.

PLAYMAXX, Inc., Yo-yo factory, 1665 E. 18th St., appointment only. 623--9981. Manufacturing, video and museum.

REID DARK includes HI CORBETT FIELD, home of Tucson Toros Triple A baseball and Cleveland Indians spring training; park zoo and 35-hole golf course.

SABINO CANYON - Lush desert garden, carved into base of Catalina Mts.; picnicking, bicycling, hiking. Cars not permitted in canyon. Shuttle service every day. Visitor center and nature trail at entrance. Follow signs to Mt. Lemmon.

SAGUARO NATIONAL MONUMENT - 53,000 acres of magnificent saguaro cacti.

RINCON MT. SECTION monument headquarters, exhibits, 9-mile circular drive; picnic grounds. On old Spanish Trail, east of Tucson. TUCSON MT. SECTION, information center, picnicking. North on Kinney Rd., past Old Tucson and Desert Museum.

SAN XAVIER MISSION, "The White Dove of the Desert." Built in 1783, one of the finest Spanish Mission

architectures in the U.S. Take 1-19 to Valencia Rd., west to Mission Rd., south to San Xavier Rd.

TITAN MISSILE MUSEUM - Guided tours of missile complex, including silo. Call for reservations 625-7735. On Duval Mine Rd., south of Tucson on 1-19.

TOMBSTONE - "The Town Too Tough to Die!" Historic silver boomtown. Visit Boothill Cemetery, O. K. Corral, museums. Take 1-10 east to #80, south to Tombstone, 59 miles southeast of Tucson.

TUBAC - Oldest European settlement in Arizona, founded 1752; arts and crafts village, galleries and shops, 15 miles south of Green Valley on 1-19.

TUMACACORI MISSION, south of Tubac on 1-19; church built in 1800's. Adjoining museum.

TUCSON GREYHOUND PARK - Exciting dog racing, 2501 S. Third Ave.

UNIVERSITY OF ARIZONA, located in downtown Tucson. Exceptional interests include Arizona State Museum, Flandrau Planetarium, and University Art Gallery. Start at main gate at Park Ave. & University Blvd. Guide at Student Union Hall, pick up map & guide.

VALLEY OF THE MOON, 2544 E. Allen, near Country Club Rd. Miniature fantasy world built by amateur magician and entertainer, giving tours and showing off performing bunnies. Call 881-13635. 2-4 Sunday
